The prosecutors used this convicted felon who had become an informant for the FBI following this indictment as a major witness and source during their investigation, but never disclosed this inherent conflict to the WIAA or the Bellevue School District as it would have meant they would have not been able to perform this very high profile investigation due to their conflict of interest with a Bellevue High School parent whom they had previously indicted.
