This is true for many European countries whose inhabitants need to learn English as a foreign language if they want to participate in education or among diverse fields in the workforce. In other parts of the world, it might be Spanish, Hindi, Mandarin Chinese, Arabic or other languages which will be serving a similar role. This need for learning a second language is understood well in many educational programs, including those for students with special educational needs. However, to date, there is not much research of the experiences of persons with diverse additional needs as learners of foreign languages.
