Behind this practice lies the scientifically unwarranted assumption that a person's fitness can be determined by the chemistry of their urine or other bodily fluids, much like the fictional, crackpot Laputans satirized by Jonathan Swift in *Gulliver's Travels*. In fact, drug testing does not measure fitness or impairment, but rather the presence of certain drug residues that may have no deleterious effect at all. This is especially the case with marijuana, the most popular, safe, and medically useful illegal drug, whose presence is typically detectable for days or weeks after last use by urine testing, long after any impairing effects have faded. Ironically, urine testing is far more sensitive to marijuana than more dangerous drugs, such as opiates, amphetamines, and alcohol (which isn't even checked for in urine tests). Therefore drug testing can have the counterproductive effect of encouraging workers to move from marijuana to more dangerous, less detectable substances such as designer drugs, alcohol, and prescription narcotics, while at the same time depriving them of the medicinal benefits of cannabis. Moreover, of course, it subjects users and non-users alike to an obnoxious invasion of intimate bodily privacy.
